Guideline of the Board for the doctoral study program 4I3 – Matematical linguistics, No. 1/2012 (translated from Czech by Zdeněk Žabokrtský)

This guideline elaborates the process of state doctoral exams in 4I3 – Mathematical linguistics.

- 1. An exam organized after 1/1/2013 embraces a defence of a thesis proposal. The proposal should briefly introduce goals of the planned doctoral thesis, survey of related literature, proposed solutions, intended outcomes and expected time schedule.
- 2. The student submits the proposal to the chair of the exam board not later than one month before the exam. The proposal is written in Czech or in English; its minimal size is 10 A4 pages.
- 3. The chair of the exam board chooses an opponent, who prepares a review of the proposal. The student's advisor and consultant(s) cannot review the proposal.
- 4. The opponent sends the review to the student and to the members of the exam board at least one week before the exam.
- 5. The student presents a short summary of the proposal at the beginning of the exam. Then the opponent presents the review and the board discusses the proposal with the student thoroughly. A successful defence is needed for a successful exam pass.
- 6. The thesis proposal defence is optional for those who started their doctoral study in 2012/2013 or before.
